Our Mission

The Wounded Warrior Regiment (WWR) provides leadership and ensures compliance with laws and Department of Defense regulations related to the support, recovery, and non-medical care of combat and non-combat wounded, ill, and injured (WII) Marines, Sailors attached to Marine units, and their family members in order to maximize their recovery as they return to duty or transition to civilian life.

How We Serve

The Commandant's intent is that WII Marines should remain assigned to their parent units, as long as their medical conditions allow and their units can support them.

When recovery needs are too great, Marines may be assigned to a WWR element in order to focus completely on recovering and returning to full and unrestricted duty or transitioning to civilian life.

SPECTRUM OF CARE

Marines with complex recovery care needs may be assigned to a Wounded Warrior Battalion or Detachment, which includes state-of-the-art Warrior Hope and Care Centers at Camp Lejeune and Camp Pendleton. Marines may also remain with their parent units and receive support from a recovery care coordinator (RCC). Recovering service members (RSMs) and families have access to a full spectrum of care.



Benefits and Entitlements

WWR's administrative section supports Marines with benefits and entitlements, which includes Pay and Allowance Continuation (PAC), Special Compensation for Assistance with Activities of Daily Living (SCAADL), Traumatic Injury Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance (TSGLI), and reimbursement for non-medical attendant travel.



Disability Evaluation System (DES) Support

The DES is a mechanism for determining if RSMs are fit for duty following a wound, illness, or injury. WWR provides advocacy to RSMs through DES subject matter experts.



Medical Section

The medical section facilitates medical case management by providing advocacy and medical subject matter expertise in support of individual needs assessments of Marines and their families.



Recovery Care Coordinators

RCCs work with RSMs and their families to develop and execute their comprehensive recovery plans and coordinate with medical teams and commands to optimize recovery and transition back to full duty or to VA systems of support.



Reserve Medical Entitlements Determination (RMED) Section

The RMED section is responsible for supporting all WII Marine reservists and their unique needs.



Transition Readiness Program (TRP)

WWR's TRP assists Marines who are facing an unexpected transition due to a wound, illness, or injury by offering expertise and support as RSMs and their families prepare to attend school, find civilian employment, or start a business, if they are unable to return to duty.



Warrior Athlete Reconditioning Program (WAR-P)

WWR's WAR-P manages the provision of day-to-day adaptive rehabilitation programs and equipment and promotes an enduring Marine spirit through competitive adaptive sporting events.

WWR Outreach and Support

District Injured Support Coordinators (DISCs)/Field Support Representatives (FSRs)

DISCs and FSRs, located across the country, ease the transition of WII Marines from active or reserve status to veteran status by conducting, as needed, outreach and face-to-face visits.

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Sergeant Merlin German Wounded Warrior Call Center (WWCC)

Available 24/7, the WWCC extends support to WII Marines through advocacy, resource identification, referral, information distribution, and care coordination. Battalion contact centers support WII active duty Marines who remain with their units while recovering. Marines and families can reach us by phone or social media.
