The Veterans Curation Program (VCP) provides veterans with tangible work skills and experience through rehabilitation and preservation of federally owned or administered archeological collections. Since 2009, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, St. Lewis District, has contracted cultural resource firms to manage the VCP. This program employs and trains post-9/11 veterans in archaeological collections processing. New South Associates operates three full service VCP laboratories, located in Alexandria, Virginia, August, Georgia, and St. Louis, Missouri. Additionally, the VCP has four satellite locations at Texas State University's Center for Archaeological Studies, at Washington State University's Museum of Anthropology, at the University of Arkansas Museum, and in San Mateo, California near the College of San Mateo.

Veterans, primarily from the Afghanistan and Iraq conflicts, are employed for up to five months in both part and full time positions as Archaeological Laboratory Technicians. The VCP provides veterans with an opportunity to receive competitive pay while learning new job skills through technical training in a peer-to-peer veterans' environment. 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
